This group has met twice over the summer to discuss Club business and formulate new ideas for Club growth.

Probably the biggest accomplishment of the new Yacht Club Executive Committee, over the summer, is to establish a good working relationship between the Yacht Club and the Lake Mission Viejo Association. It has always been the aim of the Yacht Club to cooperate fully with the Lake Association by coordinating all our events with the Lake Association Board of Directors and establishing a good line of communication between the two organizations. To these ends, members of the YC Executive Committee have met several times with individuals on the LMVA Board of Directors and the YC will, from now on, have a representative at all the LMVA Board Meetings.

New Logo

The YC Executive Committee has approved a design for a YC logo. As you see above, it is a representation of the Saddlebacks with sailboats. We are now in the process of ordering T-shirts and YC Burgees. These will be available

for sale at the November regatta. So get yourself a T-shirt to wear and be the first in your fleet to fly a burgee from your mast or hang one in your den.

1980 Calendar

The YC Executive Committee has devised the 1980 Yacht Club Calendar which has been presented to and approved by the LMVA Board. The Calendar, which is included with this newsletter, provides for a monthly YC sponsored regatta and series races for the Lido, C-15 and Mutineer fleets. There is always room on the Calendar for series races. If other fleets establish a series calendar or new fleets form up they should check with Tom Scott, Race Committee Chairman for a place on the Calendar.

Trophies

Due to a generous contribution by the Mission Viejo Company the Yacht Club has been able to purchase some elegant perpetual trophies honoring regatta winners. These trophies will be unveiled at the Annual Banquet in November, and displayed in a prominent place at the Lake.

New Marks and New Courses

We have new racing marks! Many thanks to Larry Eaks, Port Captain Dick Peters, and the Race Committee.

The Race Committee has also decided to move the starting line to the middle of the Lake. They had two reasons for making this change. 1. To get the line farther away from the swimming area, and 2. To allow for courses in which the final leg is a beat. This makes a much more exciting race; now, if you are last, there is always a chance that the guy in front will get a header or somehow blow the beating leg, instead of watching the lead guy walk away with the race on that final long run down the lake.

Along with the change in the position of the starting line the RC drew up a new course chart which was used, for the first time, at the October 7 Columbus Day Regatta. All the winners expressed their approval of the change and even some of the losers liked it. A new chart is included with this letter and additional copies are available at the Lake Office. Be sure you have one with an effective date of October 1.

The full summer racing calendar is behind us now. But the fall and winter bring good winds and less crowds and there are still exciting events to look forward to.

November Regatta

Dont't miss the November Free-For-All Regatta on Sunday, November 11. The skippers' meeting will be held at 12:00 pm and the race begins at 1:00 pm. This will be a two race event and the entry fee is \$6.00. We hope to see lots of participation in this last regatta of the year. It will be a T-shirt regatta which means there is one of our new T-shirts free to each entering skipper. And we plan to serve either beer or hot mulled wine depending on the predicted weather.

Lido 14 Invitational

They are sending out 250 invitations and hope to get 50 boats on the start line. There will be five races over Saturday and Sunday of this two day event.
