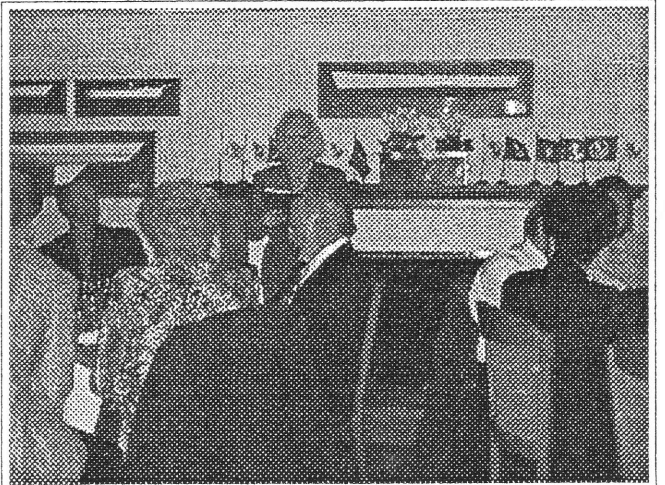
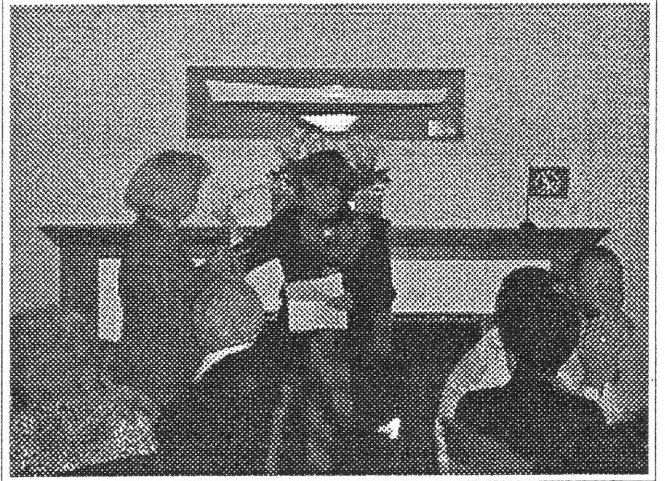
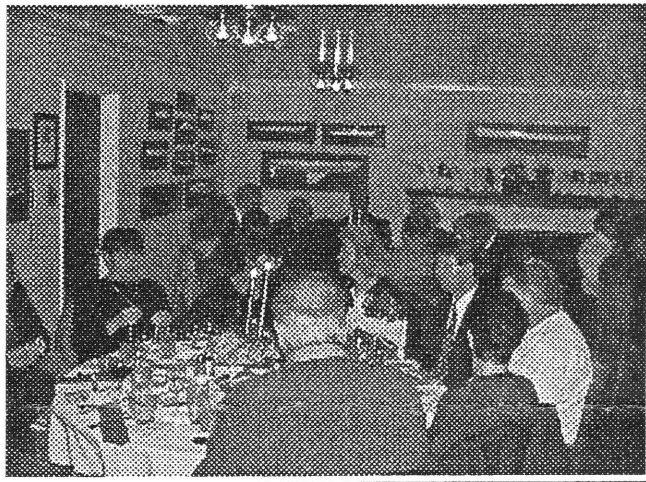
I have been asked a few times why the Club doesn't use www.lmvyc.org. The answer is financial, to regis-

2001 Sailing and Social Activity Program

The 2001 Lake Mission Viejo Yacht Club Sailing and Social Activity Program has been mailed out. If you have not received the program yet please contact Vivienne Savage the Club Secretary to request a copy. Inside the program is the Membership Application for the 2001 sailing season. Please rush your application and check for \$50 to Vivienne As soon as you can.

A new position this year is a Fleet Quartermaster. Len Savage will serve up the refreshments after the days sailing and keep the club in dry goods during the 2001 season.

As an insert for this month's newsletter you will find the rules for the LMVYC 2001 Fleet Championship Series. Rod Simenz the Race Chairman has put together a program that will reward participation, as well as sailing skills with the reward of the fleet championship at the end of the sailing season.

The first sailing event of the year is the Tune-up Regatta on Sunday February 25 at 11:30 am. With three race and refreshments after the sailing everyone will have the chance to test and tune their boats for the 2001 sailing season.

LMVYC 2001 Fleet Championship Series

The series will consist of the following eight Regattas:

<u>Date</u>	<u>Event</u>
February 25	Tune-up Regatta
March 18	Opening Regatta
April 29	Spring Regatta I
May 20	Spring Regatta II
August 5	Mid-Summer Regatta
August 26	24 th Annual Regatta
September 23	Fall Regatta
November 18	Turkey Regatta

Note: Each skipper will be allowed to throw out 3 races of the possible 24.

1. FLEETS

One Design- Lido 14, C-15 and Thistle fleets will be recognized when at least three boats of a class (sailing in accordance with class rules) participate in a minimum of four of the designated Series regattas.

Open fleets- All participants will be assigned to one of three fleets as follows:

The "A" fleet will consist of Thistles, C-15's Finns and any other comparable performing boats. (i.e. Portsmouth rating .95 or less)

The "B" fleet will consist of Lido 14's, Capri 14.2's (center board) and any other comparable performing boats. (i.e. Portsmouth rating .96 to 1.15)

The "C" fleet will consist of all lake rental boats (currently Capri 14.2 keel and Holder 12) and any other comparable performing boats. (i.e. Portsmouth rating 1.16 and higher.)

2. AWARDS

Individual awards will be presented to participants in recognized One Design fleets and to those in the "A", "B", and "C" fleets. First place finishers will be recognized as Fleet Champion for the year. The number of awards will be as follows:

1-2 participants- No awards.

3-4 participants- First and second place

5 or more- First, second and third place

Perpetual trophies for the "A", "B", "C" Lido 14, C-15 and Thistle Fleets will be maintained to recognize each fleet champion.

A boat that qualifies as a participant in a one design fleet cannot also have her score recorded as a participant in an open fleet, or vice versa unless at the end of the season, the one design fails to qualify as a "recognized" fleet.

3. SCORING

The Low Point Scoring System, Rule A2 will apply, except that a boat not starting a race will be scored the number of starters in that race plus one.

Series standings for all participants will be updated and posted after each regatta.
