
Visit to US Sailing Center in Bristol, RI

The LMVYC Junior Program has taught many youth how to sail and introduced them to competitive racing, where they have done very well. We are proud to be represented by some exceptional kids on and off the water. Many of our juniors go on to excel in high school and college and eventually in their careers.

Recently Ezugo Ononye was honored for his accomplishments on Fox TV's Good Day LA. Ezugo is a very busy person, besides being on the varsity sailing team, he is on his way to becoming an Eagle Scout and will be class Vice President at Sage Hill High School. He recently gathered \$5,000 in backpacks filled with school supplies for those less fortunate in Mexico for his Eagle Scout pro-



ject. He is also on the varsity water polo team. He is deeply involved in the Girls Empowerment Movement (GEM) Chapter on campus to "make a difference" for the young women in his community.



He founded Boys Against Rape Culture in November to take on a larger conversation about "rape culture" and the male role in it. "A lot of people don't look to men as allies to the [feminist] cause," Ezugo said. "It shouldn't be unusual to have a guy talk about problems that we're perpetuating in our society. So, I felt that by starting BARC and working with GEM, I can show there a lot of male allies to the feminist cause."

Meetings typically feature experts invited from UC Irvine and elsewhere in the community to speak to groups of about 10 to 15 students about rape culture. Previous topics of the meetings, which occur every two months, focused on sexual harassment in the workplace and at school and on consent and healthy relationships.

So next time you see Ezugo around the club ask him about this and other important issues that he is working on. This club is so about so much more than sailing, as he will tell you.

- Always loudly scream "Shark!" while standing at the edge of the water to ensure everyone is aware that so many species of sharks are endangered and will go extinct if not protected from commercial fishing
