That's the headline on a flyer from the USC Varsity Sailing Team, host for the event held January 4 and 5. Many of the nation's best collegiate sailors from 26 schools joined 63 of California's high school teams in the competition held off Belmont pier in Long Beach. Why Rose Bowl? The title honors the traditional college football New Year day classic in nearby Pasadena.

Point Loma high school sailing team had won the last seven Rose Bowl regattas and their coach noted that several of their alumni were represented this year by Kevin Laube at Stanford, Jake Labow at St. Mary's, Jake Reynolds at Charleston and A.J. Reiter at Georgetown. That's impressive.

Guy Heaton, new coach for our high school sailing team had the idea this would be a great opportunity to introduce a few of our sailors to the spectacle of 500 high school and college sailors competing at the regatta. Guy's sailing buddy and former collegiate All American sailor from college days, Bob Little, of-



fered to take his 30-foot sail boat out to the race course. Junior club officers Bella Murdy, Erik Ponti, Tyler Peyatt and Ali Murdy; Jr. Commodore, Jr. Vice Commodore, Fleet Captain and Secretary/ Treasurer respectively, were driven by CeCe Murdy to Long Beach to join Bob Little at his boat. Then they all motored out to the event.

Sadly, Long Beach noted for its great sailing conditions was in the doldrums with zephyr winds. They were only able to sail two races on Saturday. The junior club officers, unfortunately, did not get to view much sailing due to a lack of wind, but did occasionally get a glimpse of both high school and college teams sailing. Granting there was a deprivation of wind, the juniors were still given an exciting perspective of higher-level sailing. After cruising around, Bob and Guy surprised the juniors with a hidden treasure and took them to visit sea lions that rested on a buoy not far from where the races were held. This was a great way to end a fantastic day on the water.


