



"Way to Go"

One of our longtime members, Rod Simenz, is stepping down from a position he's held for over fifteen years as the Junior Sailing director, during which time he's taught innu-

merable young boys and girls not just to sail, but to race.

From February to November every year he reached out to the Mission Viejo community to find interested juniors. Very few had ever sailed before, so three or four afternoons a week he could be found out on the lake, teaching them the basics. As with any sport some juniors found the excitement of competition to be just what they wanted, others were content to enjoy just becoming proficient on the water.



Rod taught and enjoyed working with all the young sailors. Through the years some of these same young sailors have given many of our racing members a real challenge here on the lake. But one of Rod's, and of his students, favorite events is when he's taken them to other clubs to compete in harbor racing. He's spent years hauling them, and their boats, to youth races at other yacht clubs up and down the coast, scouring their websites for racing days open to juniors, lining up who wanted to go, and those who liked to sail but not to compete.

Almost always these jaunts to other clubs have also involved the parents who helped. Over the years the parents participation opened up to the family the real pleasure and comradeship that exist between sailors and parents at other clubs, forging new friendships, and spreading word of our lakeside club.

After fifteen years and literally teaching hundreds of young people to sail, Rod has decided he wants to retire from those often four days a week teaching to sail, and concentrate on just coaching the fewer number who wish to do some serious racing here and at other venues, and who want some specialized coaching. This will lessen his workload considerably and give him more free time. Through the years he has held many other positions in the Club, but perhaps his greatest contribution to our club has been his drive and untiring efforts to enrich the club with a thriving successful junior program.
