A Class Act Week End- 3/13&3/14

Saturday and Sunday marked two days of intensive racing competition on the lake. LMVYC hosted the C-15 Invitational on Saturday, which was also the first race of the 1999 C-15 Coast Cup series. The series consists of ten regattas scheduled throughout the year at various locations including Huntington Lake, Big Bear Lake, King Harbor and Mission Bay.

The A and B fleets of C-15's raced four races with one throw out. Winds were light and shifty topping out briefly(very) at eight knots. The race committee headed by Don Schaffner and assisted by Milly Thomas, Ced Fields, Vivienne Savage and Doug Sheppard selected innovative, fun race courses which included moving the starting line for the last two races from buoy #2 up to "F" mark to ensure good weather legs for each race. Results: Horst Weiler and Graham Newman took first place in the "A" Fleet. Willi Hugelshofer sailed to two second places with Tara Robison as crew and had two fourth place finishes with a different Robison as crew which gave him fourth place over all. Tim Paternoster was first in the "B" Fleet. Audrey Simenz won two races and placed second overall in "B".

Doug Sheppard brought vegetable snacks and dip for the race break on Saturday as well as on Sunday for the Thistle/Lidos,The C-15 regatta dinner featured two kinds of lasagna from Tara Robison with a salad prepared by Caecilla Weiler. Linda and Don Schaffner took care of all the other details and amenities that made the post race social activity a great success.

Sundays' regatta featured the Thistle and Lido 14 classes. This was a milestone day on the lake since it was the first Thistle Invitational in many years and the first Lido Invitational in living memory. The visiting Thistle sailors came from Newport Harbor. The Lido 14 sailors- Alamitas Bay, Newport Harbor and one boat, sailed by Joe D'Amico, came clear from Sequim, Washington. Joe is a very active Lido sailor and brings his boat down to sail in several of the Southen California regattas this time of year. He is currently a director of the Lido 14 International Class Association. The race committee for the day was chaired by Horst Weiler with help from Roger Robison, and Steve and Tricia Gonsowski. Each fleet had its own race chart with courses specially selected to enhance the competition. Fortunately, the winds cooperated and Horst was able to select some challenging courses. The winds topped out at about twelve knots and were some what steady for most of the day.
