# Red Cross Award for LMVYC Junior Sailor Griffyn Pugh S/C Audrey Simenz



You may remember an article in our Main Sheet newsletter last year about the dramatic rescue of a racing member who had fallen out of his boat during a regatta and was in trouble, hanging on to the stern. Junior member Griffyn Pugh, racing a CFJ, with his sister McKenna, saw what had happened and immediately went to his aid by sailing alongside the Expo and leaping aboard to take control of the empty boat in the high wind, leaving the crew, his sister, to sail the CFJ.

The first life guard on the scene commented that he was impressed with Griffyn's sailing knowledge and cool confidence throughout the incident. Griffyn was commended for his quick thinking and rescue effort.

A few weeks ago Red Cross headquarters in Washington DC notified Griffyn that they had awarded him their *Certificate of Extraordinary Personal Action*, for his heroic and selfless rescue. It was awarded to him by a Red Cross representative in Orange County. Congratulations Griffyn, from the officers and members of Lake Mission Viejo Yacht Club.

To get things started an interest sheet and a flyer were circulated at

the June regatta. The interest response for both skippers and crew was excellent. The concept that evolved was to sail the new Capri 14.2 keel boats and CFJs. There were two classes for the Capri 14.2 k, one for experienced skippers and one for novices. Once the list of skippers and crew was finalized there was a lot of practice sailing by the teams during the summer months leading up to the regatta.

On race day things started with a boat selection lottery, then a continental breakfast for skippers, their crew and race committee in the Club Room.
