A FOND FAREWELL...

Some 34 years ago now I walked into Horst's office for a job interview. With my application in his hands he read my qualifications and when his eyes travelled down to "things you like to do" he saw that I had written "Sailing". His ears pricked up! I was hired instantly.....and offered to crew on his sailboat. That lead in turn to many regattas, competitions and eventually The Nationals. From my first time trying the trapeze (hesitantly) trusting not only my skipper but also the wire and harness!! Then came the ocean of which we were both not great fans of, but yearly we had to compete. This meant being thrown from one wave to another, dragged attached to the trapeze until the next wave threw you right back into the boat. Going to Big Bear for 2 days of racing was great fun.



At one time there was snow on the foredeck from an overnight flurry ...in May!!!!

Racing Nationals on Huntington Lake in the High Sierras was the day after Horst turned 50 so after his party he collected me at 4am, drove 4 and half hours, launched the boat and sailed 5 qualifying races!! We had no reservations, no camping equipment, just 2 sun lounge chairs and sleeping bags to sleep those nights under the trees....plus one eye open for bears! We did find, surprisingly, a Cordon Bleu chef that whisked up some wonderful dishes and after a hot shower we were ready to go again for 2 more days of racing. Our C-15 Coast Cup team mates were a wonderful family, always assisting us or passing on good advice, etc.

Our favorite race was at King Harbor where the racing was a portsmouth start and you had to have a compass. Very challenging when the legs were 4 miles apart and one race took 3 and half hours! We were happy to win that race a couple of times.

Finally, end of season was always "Hot Rum Race" at Mission Bay, San Diego. Boy, you needed that hot drink in December after racing was complete!

Back home on the lake when I first joined Horst in 1984 there was no Club like there is today.....just 5 guys: Horst, Will, Bruce, Tony and myself. We stood around the BBQ and cooked our own hamburgers. At the end of the year, along with our wives, we used to go to a restaurant for dinner. Gradually the Club grew and Horst took his place at the Round Table Pizza every Wednesday night with his back to the wall so that he would not miss a pretty girl coming in the door!!!! We retired from competitive racing as a team off the lake many years ago, but he never gave up giving advice and telling stories (some "taller" than others!)

He will be sadly missed. His boat Agrippina will hopefully remain on the lake for many years and enjoyed by all who care to sail her.

Farewell my friend and skipper.

This is our Fourth Annual Fundraiser for our junior program. Your support is needed and appreciated. Please make your tax-deductible donation to the Mission Viejo Youth Sailing Foundation (MVYSF) today.

MVYSF supports and promotes competitive sailing for boys and girls ages 8 to 18 and provides them the opportunity to participate in local and regional sailing competition. This year MVYSF has provided LMVYC three Sabots, a second boat trailer and a new Sabot racing sail. The foundation also provided grants to our juniors to help defray expenses to attend the BYC Advanced Sabot Sailing Clinic, the Sabot Junior Nationals and the RS Tera North American Championship.

Our juniors have had an outstanding year competing at many sailing events in Southern California. See enclosed regatta list and results. Currently many of our juniors who have trained in eight foot Sabots are now becoming teenagers ready to move on to bigger boats like the Laser and CFJ. The yacht club's 30-year-old CFJs are good practice boats but they are well worn and have competitive deficiencies. For that reason it is the foundation's number one goal to provide a newer CFJ so our juniors can be more competitive at 2019 regional regattas, Junior Olympics and the CFJ National Championship.

The foundation is run entirely by volunteers so 100 % of your contributions are used to promote and support our youth in sailing competition. Fun things to do in 2019




It's not too soon to start thinking about what events to mark on your calendar for 2019.

Dear LMVYC Members,

In 2017 the board initiated a club boat user fee to help defray the annual maintenance cost of more than \$1,000 for club owned boats and related equipment. As mentioned in the 2017 email from then Commodore Mark Glackin, our low club dues are not sufficient to cover these costs which do not include time generously donated by our fleet captain, port captain, race chair and many others. For 2018, the budget was increased to \$1200, however YTD expenses have already exceeded that amount. Therefore, the board finds it necessary to continue with the maintenance fee schedule as follows:
